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Inspire to Act!

Founded in 2010 by journalist Frédérique Bedos, **Le Projet Imagine** is an information NGO whose mission is to raise citizenship awareness with a view to developing a more inclusive and sustainable society. It raises public awareness through inspiring films and it empowers citizens through programs that support actions in line with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals.

Since 2017, Le Projet Imagine enjoys special consultative status at the UN Economic and Social Council.

The Imagine School Program (ISP) is a unique educational tool with a twofold mission.

It allows students to gradually open up to citizenship awareness as well as to the concepts of individual and collective responsibility.

It provides them with training in non-academic subjects, such as teamwork and project management (design and implementation by students of a joint sustainable development project).

Kits are delivered turnkey to educational supervisors who can attend two training sessions (per group of 15 maximum):

- A 4-hour* training session on the Inspiration Kit
- A 1h30* training session on the Action Kit

*The duration of the training sessions can vary according to each educational team's requirements.

Training packages

Personalized coaching by Imagine facilitators is provided remotely and in the classroom (upon request) throughout the program.

Contents of the Imagine School Program

Once trained by the ISP team, each teacher will facilitate the sessions.

FROM KINDERGARTEN TO HIGH SCHOOL, A THREE-PHASE PROGRAM :

- 1** Inspiration Kit, 5 sessions of 55 minutes each: a pathway that leads students to **self-discovery** through time allowed to personal reflection; **discovery and recognition** of others through team building games and time to share opinions and emotions; **emerging of a common entity** that is aware of its capacity and responsibility to act.
- 2** Action Kit (from age 7): 4 sessions of 55 minutes each during which students develop their group project using **project management methodological tools**.
- 3** Implementation of the common sustainable development project: a few extra hours, depending on the nature of the project, and whether it is implemented **inside the school or in partnership with local community players**.

INSPIRATION KIT

FOR ALL AGES

THE INSPIRATION KIT

is based on a key concept presented below, which is adapted according to class levels.

KINDERGARTEN - Discovery

- Discovering the connection to others and developing one's ability to express oneself.
- Exploring Nature in the surrounding environment (garden, animals...)
- 1 Day dedicated to a common action (school vegetable garden).

AGE 7-8 - Basic knowledge

- Me and my environment
- Language and communication
- Interknowledge

AGE 9 - 11 - Consolidation cycle

- Sharing and being tolerant
- Self-respect and self-confidence
- Accepting differences

AGE 12 - 14 - Cycle of in-depth studies

- Environment and sustainable development
- Non-violent communications
- Children and inequalities in the world

AGE 15 - 17 - Main theme: Human Rights

- Perception and Interculturalism
- Major societal issues (gender equality, justice)
- International migration

ACTION KIT

STARTING AT AGE 6

THE ACTION KIT

is the logical follow-up to the development of a culture of citizenship commitment. It encourages students to work together on the design and implementation of a group project.

We encourage students to be pro-active and to experiment with responsibilities, within the framework of tools inspired by project management methodology.

Students aged 6 TO 14 are encouraged to develop their talents and abilities and to decide on their role and responsibilities in a team. Under the guidance of the educational supervisor, they strengthen their ability to work together towards the achievement of a common goal by using the tools provided to plan and implement a joint sustainable development project on their own scale.

Students aged 12 TO 17 experiment the key steps of project management: selecting a concrete and achievable goal, setting up an operational team, organizing their timeline and successfully deploying the various actions needed to implement a joint sustainable development project.

- Turnkey, designed to develop students' citizenship awareness.
- It includes animation techniques inspired by non-formal education that are used to mobilize students through **experimentation**.
